



Repeater Etiquette Tips – Determine How to Enter Conversation

- Directed Method Calling a Specific Operator
- Monitoring Method Calling anyone . . . . Different on VHF/UHF and HF
- Interrupting a Conversation . . . Break, Comment, Info
- Others?





#### Repeater Etiquette Tips – Transmitting Guidelines

Communication is not Private

Mic Setting and Position

Listen to ensure Repeater is not in use

Pause before replying

Allow others to join the conversation

Avoiding "Doubling"

Call Sign Announcements

NATO phonetic alphabet and the Q - Codes

Kirchunking

Arguments and Jammers

Inappropriate topics and language
